<u>Class Book – 'The Three Little Pigs'</u>- compare different versions of the story with alternative version of the story 'The Three Little Wolves and the Big Bad Pig'. <u>Handwriting</u> – correct letter formation, use line guides appropriately. Y2s – joined handwriting. <u>Phonics & Grammar</u> – further exploration of spelling patterns, punctuation, prefixes and suffixes.

Maths

Continue work on calculations - extending knowledge of addition, subtraction multiplication and division. Use the skills to complete problem solving tasks. Introducing fractions - exploring halves, quarters (Y1) and thirds (Y2). Measurement – exploring capacity, length and mass.

Time – Y1 – o'clock and half past times.

- Y2 – telling the time in 5 minute intervals.

Geometry –using positional language.

Science

Materials and their properties – consider that materials are chosen for specific purposes due to their features. E.g. house building

Carry out a series of investigations in which we test the suitability of materials for specific purposes – linked to topic of houses.
